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Burning down the house

After 13 years of sold-out events in New York City, Berlin, London, Las Vegas, San Francisco and Los Angeles, Hustlaball once again hit the U.K. shores last month, bringing a red-hot parade of international party people ready to get in on the fun. This year the party was held at London's epicentre of gay clubbing, the infamous club FIRE, with its seemingly endless array of glittering dancefloors, secret backrooms and lounges. Many of the biggest porn companies in the industry participated, with Raging Stallion, Hot House, Falcon, Lucas Entertainment, Bel Ami and Stag Homme

sending pornstars over for the party. Hustlaball is legendary for mixing the best of both the porn and dance music worlds, with cutting edge DJs appealing to everyone from high-energy contemporary electro-tribal fans to house music aficionados seeking slower, sleazier sets. A roster of international DJs performed throughout the club, with LED-light-and-sound installations, kink-themed rooms, and outdoor garden, offering distinct aural, visual, and sensual choices.

This July unique voluntary organisation SM Gays celebrates three decades of providing education and support to the gay male SM community. The occasion will be marked with two special events at the organisation's longstanding London base The Hoist.

SM Gays began when 20 gay men met informally in Brixton in 1981. Recognising the need for a non-judgemental and non-commercial social space for SM practitioners, and to improve understanding of SM safety, the group set themselves three objectives which are still

current today: to acquire new skills; to provide education; and to provide a safe, social space for people interested in safe, sane and consensual SM.

The organisation has been run throughout its history entirely on a voluntary, not-for-profit basis, and over the years has involved hundreds of volunteers. It regularly donates money to trusts and charities such as the Eddie Surman Trust, the Food Chain and Mildmay Hospice.

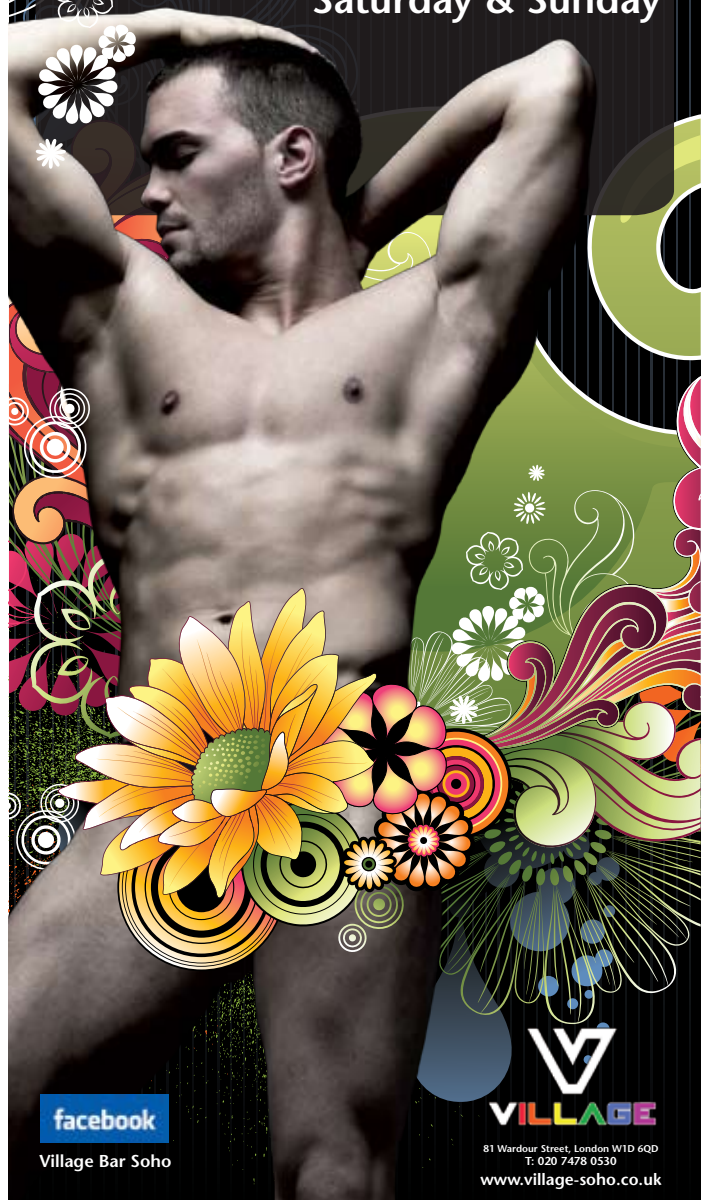

Editor's Words

I was recently asked if I thought there were too many gay people on television: Alan Carr, Graham Norton, Paul O'Grady, Dale Winton, Stephen Fry...? It seemed like it was a list he'd prepared earlier.



I wondered what his motive was for asking me such a question when all I could see from this list was a bunch of much-loved personalities just being themselves... and in truth, I told him, I thought that is why they were popular and heading up prime time TV. He countered that perhaps it was more to do with them being stereotypes and not that offensive to 'normal' society. I bit my lip. I wondered if he'd ever seen any of these acts away from the TV. Certainly Paul O'Grady, in his former life as Lily Savage, could hardly be called inoffensive and I would suspect that Paul has a problem keeping a lid on opinions at the best of times. Alan Carr's stage act takes no prisoners whether he's being as bent as a nine-bob note or not, he'll tear you a new one if he's feeling that way out. However, TV has its own rules and in many ways it is this 'A' list of gays who are breaking the programme format mould and changing the way some members of the public regard homosexuals. They aren't afraid to say it as they see it. They talk about

things with no distinction as to whether it is a straight or a gay topic. It just is. The fact that there are more gay storylines in dramas and soaps is just the fact that we are more visible now. We have problems. We have lives. We have... well we have the same everything as everyone else. It may appear that all there ever seems to be is gay this or gay that but that is simply because we now refuse to be invisible and those that wish that we would slink back into the closet or just disappear... can, in the words of Lily Savage, "Go f@*k themselves". It has hardly seen the end of hetero storylines or happy families in sit-coms... after years of only one view of the world... it is great to see an alternative.

Meanwhile, it's great/pathetic (you delete as necessary) to see that every mention of the word gay is being picked over by the media. If it's not Anne Robinson suggesting to a vicar that his multi-coloured shirt was a "trifle gay" or one of the TV companies having to defend a gay kiss in some soap or other... the Stonewall slogan of the last few years has never seemed more appropriate - Some People Are Gay.... Get Over It.

On a similar theme? The United Nation's Human Rights Council has passed a resolution calling for universal rights for gay, lesbian, bi and trans people. It didn't pass with flying colours, a 23 - 19 split and with three abstentions, as those countries with an appalling record on rights for their citizens rallied against the declaration. I wish the UN well and hope that they will pursue transgressors with a great deal of vigour... no matter what religious, cultural or metaphysical twaddle they come up with.

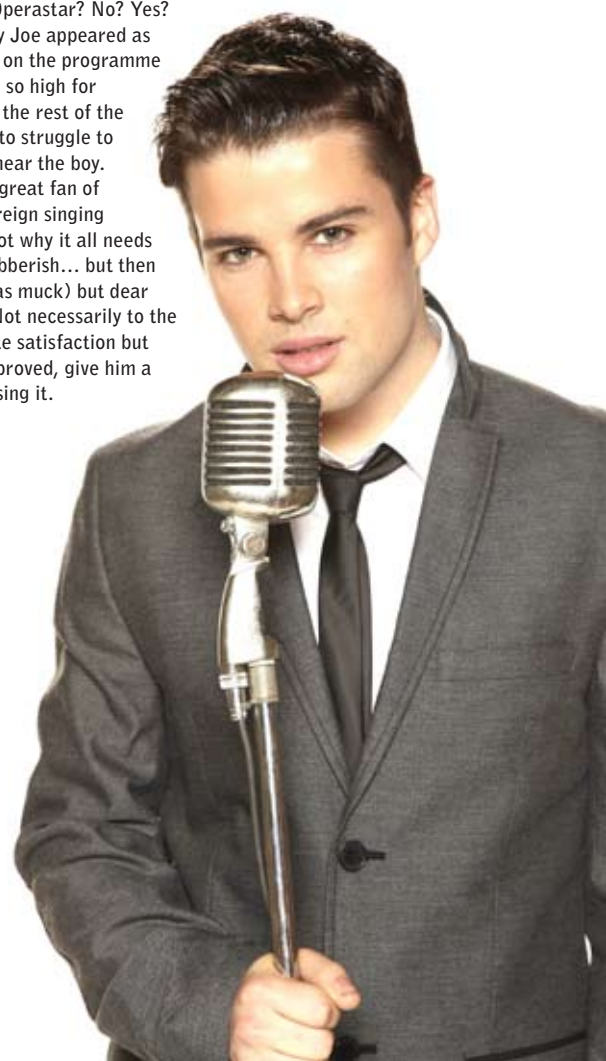

Dreamer Girl
Out Now

'Dreamer Girl' is a chilled out, soulful kinda song, with echoes of both Corinne Bailey Rae and Sade, but possessed of a style that is uniquely Asa's. There are easy ripples of funk throughout this folksy little number, which unfurls with whispery vocals and a summer-soaked chorus. This laidback triumph invites the listener to daydream every bit as much as the protagonist, and revels in the tension between imaginative escape and the pull of the real world, which stops Asa from completely drifting off in a cloud of her own devising and roots this in a very tender appreciation of human frailty.



CEE LO GREEN
I Want You (Hold On to Love)
4th July

So the sentiment of this song is hardly new, but Cee Lo Green is adept at reminding us his voice is perfectly suited for more soulful songs as well as pop. This one lacks the upbeat irony of 'Fuck You', with its bouncy pop tunes and casually defiant lyrics, but nonetheless succeeds because of the reverberating, dark treacle that is Cee Lo Green's signature singing. The dance remixes really bring this track to life for an entirely more commercial crowd, too, ensuring that he won't lose the audience that loved him for 'Fuck You'.



BURAKA SOM SISTEMA
Hangover (BaBaBa)
4th July

Portuguese dance mash-up masters Buraka Som Sistema whisk dubstep, house and kuduro into a crazy froth of Latin grime. Fat basslines and a ridiculously catchy hook (the 'BaBaBa') are designed to keep your head nodding and your body popping. The tune is surprisingly simple compared to similar offerings spinning in nightclubs at the moment, and what you end up with is a pared-down throb that's all the more effective because it isn't drowned in production and white noise. I'd be lying if I didn't admit to shaking my backside to this one for at least thirty minutes straight.



CARO EMERALD
That Man
11th July

'That Man' is a swinging, 50s-flavoured camp classic. Full of jazz band energy, leg-kicking samba sass and infectious bossa nova highlights, this is a deliciously retro confection. Caro Emerald is one of those hourglass girls with a flower in her dark hair and red, red lips, and her lyrics are full of wit and confidence that can't help but endear her to us. This Dutch singer could teach Jessica Rabbit a thing or two about contemporary 50s chic.

Stronger (3 Beat)

Morillo & Thoneick pair up once again (after last year's huge Live Your Life) alongside the amazing Shawnee Taylor on vocals for what will be one of the biggest tracks of the year. Stronger is all about house music - bringing incredible energy to the dancefloor with its huge hooks and infectious vocals. It's a record you just cannot ignore and already has been hammered by the major players. Uplifting, funky and bang on the money, you won't be able to ignore this all summer!



Andain
Promises (Black Hole Recordings)

Originally available on a limited promo a few months ago, this was jumped on by the likes of Ferry Corsten, Armin van Buuren and Marco V. Part trance, part chunky house, Andain's trademark beautifully haunting voice once again fits like a glove with the superb production of this track. Head straight for the Myon & Shane 54 Summer of Love Mix (bit of a mouthful there!) for an uplifting, progressive slab of quality house music.



RLP ft Barbara Tucker
R.E.S.P.E.C.T. (One More Tune)

A remake of one of the greatest soul records of all time – Aretha Franklin's RESPECT and already huge in Ibiza and across Europe this year. This time, the vocals are provided by another legendary diva – Barbara Tucker (most famous for hits Beautiful People and I Get Lifted). Pick of the mixes comes from Antoine Clamaran, with a tribal infused darker offering, full of swirling stabs and masculine chanting. What you want, baby I got it!

Gypsy & the Cat are Goldfrapp underwater. Their music is trippy, synth-driven, distorted, electro, pop-tastic and shimmering. From the moment you press play the waters close around you and sounds come in strange and thick, bubbling around your head and breaking in great waves which are felt rather than seen or heard. The overall effect is at once engaging, as you would expect from the surrounding imminence of being submerged, but at once distances you from reality. This is blissed-out summer pop in 80s glitz, a kaleidoscope in watercolours, and like the Sumerian hero of the album's title, this is a descent into some strange other world. But it's also a journey which, when you reach the surface again, leaves you washed clean, floating and buoyant.

But there are some runaway masterpieces from less well-known names such as Bozswell, who opens with the delectably soulful 'I Can't Be What You Want Me to Be', to the dancier 'People Know' by Arj Snoek. Kohncke is more widely known through his day job as a creator of film scores in France, but here his love of music and his skills as a remix DJ are put centre stage and, for us in the office at least, suggest he should pack in the day job to do this full-time. Texas-born soul singer Jessica Clemmons' voice runs thick, deep and luxurious as vinyl through the fingertips. Her vocals are matched by arrangements by Chicago impresario Carey Deadman, production by John Ravenhall (who's worked with Sting and Sir Paul McCartney), mixing by Beyonce's Larry Sturm, and strings by Chicago Philharmonic. 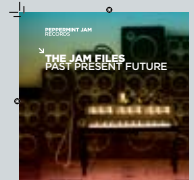

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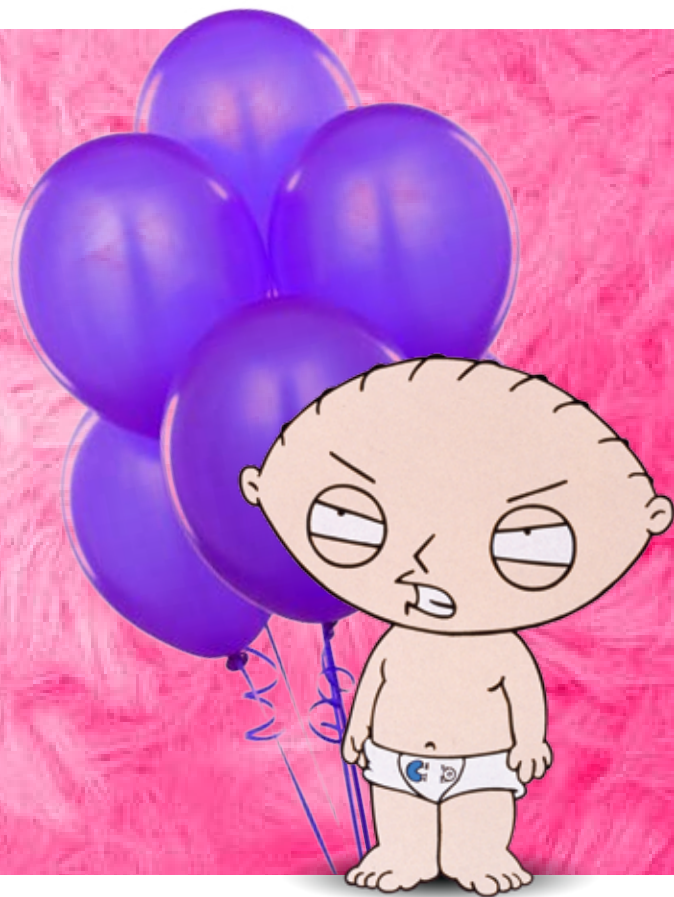

Family Guy's Stewie. Bungle. The 1960s Batman. Fanny the Wonder Dog. Andy Warhol. Cilla Black even Simon Cowell's one liners. All of them iconic, all of them loved, all of them camp.

Isn't life great with a dash of camp? It's not always easy to define, sometimes it's about being ironic, sometimes it's about exaggeration and sometimes it just is what it is. It's gay and yet it really isn't, as often things that are defined as camp owe this to being associated outside the realms of homosexuality. All the saucy goings on in a Carry On film between Sid James and Barbara Windsor? Camp. Heterosexual interior designer Lawrence Llewelyn Bowen painting a room purple? Camp. They're camp because they're examples of exaggerated behaviour set out to shock and amuse. It's not what you expect, it's often what you think it is and yet it's ever evolving, taking on new forms and assimilating wondrous iconic pieces into the camp collective. Sometimes things can become camp through the passage of time yet other times camp needs no measurement at all to take hold and shape an idea. Camp is what's fun when everything seems miserable and it brightens the day. Camp is the preposterous notions spouted by someone who so painstakingly wants to be taken seriously that they have entered

Campville and they have no idea on how to get out. It's a way of life, it's a bold statement and it's that feeling that some things can be steamrollered over if they're just plain absurd. It's something which has been embraced and used as a force for good to assert those who need a voice amongst the haze and the din. It can break down the borders and unite everyone who has ever giggled at anything straight laced. Sometimes it panders to stereotypes and sometimes it makes up its own rules. It's sharp, it's sassy, it's fluffy, pink, leather bound and studded. Without camp there would be no Manilow, no Midler, no Clary or O'Grady. There'd be no Zippy, no Skeletor, no Davros and no Danny Zuko. Camp exists in order to poke fun at anything and everything without being too offensive and it does it with a knowing wink that just can't be ignored. Celebrate it; invite it into your life because chances are it's crept in their somewhere even if you thought you'd escaped it. Maybe camp is hiding in the wardrobe amongst a row of T-shirts and maybe it's slotted into the DVD collection and in between the CDs. Wherever you least expect it chances are it's going to be there. Don't dismiss it, because you never know when you might use it to your advantage, as it can be your best friend if you'll only give it the time of day. A culture without camp isn't really a culture; it's just a collection of stuff waiting for a day of freedom when it can truly be what it has always ached to turn into.

So embrace it, love it, don't worry too much about defining it and just accept that camp happens.

Modern Family is one of the most acclaimed American comedy shows on TV these days. It's filmed in a 'mockumentary' style but raises important issues for the gay community, such as gay marriage and adoption.

The cast includes a former Broadway star and out gay actor Jesse Tyler Ferguson, who plays Mitchell, half of a gay couple with Cameron (played by Eric Stonestreet), who are raising an adopted Vietnamese baby girl. In an age where gay couples are still fighting for the right to marry, it's an important landmark to present them on the prime time TV. Jesse came to London to talk about the success of the show, his character and comedy. "I think Cameron and Mitchell have definitely resonated with a lot of people", he said.

How did you end up taking this role?

I was in the middle of a snowstorm in New York at the time and I remember receiving the pilot script on my iPhone and reading it all the way through. I couldn't put it down. I was obsessed with it. I thought that it was an amazing show and I totally wanted the part.

How important to you is its portrayal of a gay couple?

It's very important to me. I take it very seriously and I love the responsibility that I have. I love Mitchell and Cameron.

Do you feel a massive responsibility in playing this character?

There is certainly a spotlight on both Eric and me right now. We are definitely a pop culture touchstone for the gay movement... or anyone who is looking for change in our country. Our objective at the end of the day is to make people laugh so, we don't have a big social message or political agenda with our show but we do also recognise the social ramifications that those characters have. I want the show to have the breathing space it needs to be a great comedy that just happens to have two gay characters in it.

CBS and NBC rejected the idea of Modern Family and ABC accepted and loved it. How did your life change after the show was aired?

After season one I was getting paparazzi on the streets (Laughs). I wish lawyers, teachers and doctors could have the same kind of reaction

from people saying - "I love your work". This is great. I love this.

We can see a great dynamic between the cast in the show. How do you achieve that closeness?

After we met each other for the first time, there was an immediate chemistry with all of us. It was something very natural. I do think that over time we are becoming closer and the chemistry certainly is getting deeper.

Is anything off limits with the humour? Why do you think you guys get away with jokes about sexuality, racism and positive discrimination?

I think the greatest humour is going to offend a few people. I don't think safe humour is funny. You need to push the envelope and I think people can always afford to be a little more light about things. Offending people is good, at times. There have been some jokes in scripts that haven't made it because the network considered a little bit "too far". I think that the audiences know that these characters are good people, so they let them get away with it.

Does the Modern Family working process allow for you to improvise or is it quite strict?

The writing is so spot on. Usually, whatever we come up with is not nearly as good as what they already have. But if, for some reason, something is not working, we sit down and write the scene together. However, that happens very rarely.

What's the main difference between Broadway and TV?

You get paid much more for TV. I love the immediate response you have with TV. But it's also nice to do the same show everyday of the week and understand what that character is. For the Shakespeare play I did in New York I had to learn my lines really well. When you're on TV, you try to memorize the material really quickly. By the time it's on TV, I've already forgotten what I said, but I can still remember my whole role from Shakespeare.

What's the best part of this job?

It's an amazing group of actors to work with, and I really enjoy all of them. I love playing Mitchell. It's been great. Every script has been better than the last; we have amazing writers. There's nothing hard about this job. It's a complete joy every time we come in. to work.

What's coming up?

We start filming Series 3 in August... I'm excited with the prospect of maybe getting another kid. I heard a rumour about a possibility of an episode involving a ranch where we pretend to be cowboys for a day. I don't know for sure.

Sky 1 are planning to re-run the entire two series in the near future but, if you can't wait, Modern Family is available on DVD.

I like well kept feet. Clean nails. I like a guy who knows what a pumice stone is. I also love the look of socks on a foot. The way the sock hugs the foot drives me crazy.

Do you get into smelling feet?

I love the smell of feet. Not a three or four day unwashed smell. That's a bit much for me. I prefer the natural smell mixed with the delicious odor from shoes.

Does a particular shoe get you going?

I get excited when I see a guy wearing loafers or boat shoes with no socks. Seeing their bare foot disappear into the shoe; I love it! Also, watching a guy slip their foot in and out of their shoe is a real turn-on for me.

Can you see yourself getting into exhibitionism?

I can and I have.

Do you have a story to share?

How do you feel about a man in uniform?

I love a UPS man with those hot brown socks. A baseball player uniform turns me on too. Nothing beats the business man look, though.

What is the most popular fetish?

I would guess it is a tie between foot and leather. Both have a lot of groups and websites dedicated to them. The smell and look of leather can really be intoxicating. Have you ever smelled a leather candle? I have. It is tantalizing.

Have you heard about looners?

Yes, they enjoy the feeling of balloons against their skin. Or some like the sound of balloons popping. I would like to sit down with a looner and talk to them about their fetish.

What is the most misunderstood fetish?

Cross dressing is probably the most misunderstood fetish. Some straight men enjoy cross dressing. They love the feel of stockings on their skin or the way panties look and feel. [IN BETWEEN MEN]



A relatively new online show has been creating quite a stir Stateside - In Between Men follows the lives of four friends in New York City living "in between" a gay world whose clichés they don't relate to and a straight world they don't belong.

They are Dalton, Dane, Jacob and Ben; four attractive, successful men who refuse to be defined by their sexuality. Through wild adventures, racy storylines, joys and pains, In Between Men examines the relationships they share with one another, their colleagues, lovers, and the city of New York.

At first glance, the show appears similar to past gay series like *Queer as Folk*. However, where the characters in *Queer as Folk* lived in an insular gay world (eating and breathing the LGBT community), In Between Men depicts out gay men living in a mainstream world, not fully subscribing to the practices of gaydom.

"In Between Men is not a show about men trying to be straight or denying their sexuality," says Quincy Morris, who

in addition to being the series' creator, is also the head writer and executive producer. "The characters are proud to love themselves and other men."

Dalton, the lead character of In Between Men, is based on Morris. Like the series creator, he is a young man at the top of his game. He finds little in common with the superficiality of most guys in the city and struggles with a lonely love life, wondering if he should settle for Mr. Almost-Right or hold out for someone better.

The role of Dalton was originally intended for a black actor, but when few black actors showed up to the three Manhattan auditions, Morris gave the role to Nick Matthews. According to Morris, "playing Dalton came so effortlessly to him. Nick captured the vulnerability and the strength of Dalton."

How much of Nick is in Dalton?
Nick Matthews: Dalton and I share a lot of the same characteristics. I can identify with his ambition and integrity; his work hard, play hard mentality. I'm juggling several jobs right now while I pursue my dream of being a full time actor.

What are your biggest differences?
I am a little bit more relaxed, less conservative, and I probably play a little bit harder than I work.

New York City plays a significant role in Dalton's life.
New York is the fifth character in our show. She is a silent character that speaks volumes; from the beautiful panoramic views of Central Park to the busy hustle and bustle on the streets, her presence is always there.

What is it about NYC that draws men like Dalton (and Nick) to it?
There's an energy and vibe to NYC. I've always been attracted to the craziness of the city and people. New York is one

of those places that you can go out any night of the week and meet a ton of new, interesting people from every corner of the world. People from every walk of life migrate here to try to make whatever dream they have a reality.

What led you to NYC?
Acting, but also for the freedom to be me.

Is NYC as dog-eat-dog as it appears on IN BETWEEN MEN?
I don't like to think that NYC is dog-eat-dog, because that doesn't help motivate me to get up in the morning. But, I suppose, in many ways it is. The entertainment business is straight up cut throat. I'm never surprised to hear the great lengths people go to just to land a job.

You mean?
Yeah, you know what I mean.

In Between Men turns gay stereotypes on its ear. Characters are depicted as regular guys that just happen to like guys.
It's so important to show that regular gay guys exist because we don't see many of them on TV today. I mean, it's great that shows like *Glee* and *Modern Family* are being pumped into the living rooms of all Americans to expose them to gay characters. But, so many of the characters depicted on the show tend to me real effeminate guys. It's time to break the image of the effeminate gay or at least show that other types of gay men exist. I don't think it's fair or accurate to constantly enforce images that are skewed simply for comic relief.

Are stereotypes dangerous?
Stereotypes are dangerous because they reinforce false notions. Young people within the community begin to mimic the stereotypes because they think it's the norm and the way they're expected to behave. Meanwhile, people outside the community feel they can use the

stereotypes to define the community. Of course, every stereotype is based on some truth, but it's not the reality for all.

What message do you have for teen fans watching the show who may be struggling with their own sense of self?
Life is about survival. At the end of the day you need to do what you gotta do to survive and get ahead. If you are struggling with who you are or who you feel you need to be, first weigh the situation and determine if the charade is necessary and what the consequences might be if you come out now.

Are you suggesting they hide their true selves?
I'm not advocating being a coward and living a lie. What I'm saying is that if coming out is going to put you in danger, maybe the charade is worth it momentarily. Of course, being your true self is always the best way to be but it's not always possible. IN BETWEEN MEN depicts challenges young adults face as they're trying to establish themselves in the real world. Sex, of course, is a challenge.

Is there really so much sex in the city?
If there is, I am not having it! I find New York to be a great place for dating. You can date every night of the week, but when it's time to move past the dating phase, that's when things become tricky. There is always one in the relationship that is more serious than the other, and usually the one that's less serious is afraid to risk missing out on what else might be out there.

NEWFOUNDLAND



Adrian Gillan samples British colonial history, plus stunning wildlife and scenery, on the rugged East Canadian Atlantic coast of Newfoundland – scarcely 4 hours from London by plane!

The island of Newfoundland on Canada's East coast – like closer Gibraltar, dubbed "The Rock", on account of its craggy terrain - boasts some of the Atlantic's most dramatic and attractive shoreline; a wealth of notably British colonial history; and magnificent maritime wildlife. Magically combining remoteness with sincere friendliness, 1/2-million "Newfies" (Newfoundlanders), are scarce swollen in number by a mere smattering of Labradorians. The main "city" of St. John's has a core central population of around 100,000, plus a nice little, albeit tad mixed, gay scene.

Native Indians had, naturally, dwelled in the region for millennia. The first 'Europeans' to land here – and indeed on the North American continent, period - were Vikings, at now-named L'Anse Aux Meadows, high on the Northern Peninsula, in 1003AD, making a clear settlement, but seemingly not staying long. Shortly after Columbus pioneered a more permanent route with Europe in 1492AD, Italian explorer Giovanni Cabotto, working under English patronage (as plain 'John Cabot'), claimed the region for England in 1497 - thereby in fact making it the first English colony anywhere in the world!

Despite ensuing centuries of imperial disputes – mainly between England, France and Spain - Newfoundland remained a British Colony until

Confederation within a by-then-independent Canada, in 1949, narrowly voting to avoid independence itself. It subsequently renamed, as 'Newfoundland & Labrador', in 2002 - in more overt recognition of Labrador's own distinctive history and culture. The province's economy has, mercifully, happily switched from fast-depleted cod stocks to oil.

It certainly makes sense to fly Air Canada, which runs the only direct Heathrow - St. John's route, throughout the summer, until 27 Sept 2011 - the journey naturally being possible via other main Canadian cities all-year-round. The flight is only a fraction over 4 hours, at least with the Jet Stream behind you, with time difference being just 3½ hrs behind GMT. Merits even a mere long-weekender!

St. John's & Cape Spear

Overlooking St. John's historic natural harbour, the Sheraton Hotel Newfoundland (115 Cavendish Square, St. John's - www.starwoodhotels.com), with its spa, bar and eatery, is near all scene and sights.

Explore downtown St. John's, including the oldest street in North America, Water Street, with its

myriad boutiques, bistros and colourful wooden houses, all sloping down towards the harbour.

Eat at little Chinged - (www.chingedbistro.com), with its fresh, healthy, locally-sourced creative fayre - featuring anything from stinging nettles to exotic berries - plus equally fresh, charming young male staff; or at recently-opened Simplicity (223 Duckworth; T: +1 709 722 2522) with its youthful service and tasty specials.

Learn about Newfoundland's, nay our whole planet's, awesome geological history at the lively Johnson Geo Centre (175 Signal Hill Road; www.geocentre.ca) - including the true story behind the nearby sinking of the Titanic, including how locals spread word about the disaster and coordinated the rescue.

Then, for great views back down across the town, and out over ocean and bay, visit nearby Signal Hill (National Historic Site), including Cabot Tower, maybe hiking a portion of the North Head Trail which takes you along the surrounding rugged coastline. Note: Marconi received the first transatlantic radio signal on Signal Hill in 1901!

Dominating the town's skyline, as its newly pulsing cultural heart, tour The Rooms Provincial Museum, Archives & Art Gallery (9 Bonaventure Avenue; www.therooms.ca) – a wonderful mix of old and new, in both design and content - perhaps taking in lunch at The Rooms Café for arguably the best views out over the whole city and harbour. Try the tangy caribou bolognese!



Boasting – allegedly – one of the highest densities of pubs anywhere in the world, an evening out on raucous, nay infamous, George Street - (www.georgestreetlive.ca) is a must - renowned for its live, oft-Irish-flavoured music, an almost surreal kaleidoscope of bar-hopping gigs and melodious medleys!

You'll find anywhere here gay-friendly, but for the highest gay quotient, head for Club V (14 George Street; T: +1 709 738 1113); then late-night joint, Liquid Ice (186B Water Street, above Erin's Pub).

Escape the bustle of downtown St. John's for a couple of hours and make the 20 minute drive south to Cape Spear - the most easterly point in North America, with its dramatic, doubtless-haunted 1836 lighthouse - keeping an eye out for icebergs (May-July) and whales (June-Sept) in season.

Whilst out that way, also take in the picturesque little fishing cove that is Petty Harbour.

Avalon Peninsula: Baccalieu Trail & Irish Loop

If you're only in the area for a few days, after St. John's, dodge the odd stray moose and pick up a hire car (Newfoundland has no trains) to explore the wider Avalon Peninsula - notably the Baccalieu Trail due north west, taking in historic Dildo, Heart's Content, Cupids and Brigus; plus the Irish Loop due south, notably Bay Bulls and Ferryland.

Drive 1½ hours west out of St. John's to the aptly and joyously-named little town of DILDO, located on the Baccalieu Trail, perched on Trinity Bay.

Settle into the historic, late 19th Century, 5-star George House Property (www.georgehousebnb.com) and adjacent Inn on the Bay - (www.innbythebaydildo.com), both run by the gorgeous gay couple that are Dale and Todd whose passion

for hospitality and cuisine colours everything they do. After a slow jacuzzi, attended by no less than Bulgari bath products, sip a G&T in one of several lounges whilst browsing your hosts' best-selling cook book before gorging on their latest crab creation, gazing out at a pod of frisking dolphins in the bay below! Heaven!

Enjoy lunch at the nearby harbour-view Dildo Dory Grill - (www.dildodorygrill.com) before exploring the historic community of Dildo itself, and surrounding area. Visit the local Whaling & Sealing Museum, or take an aquatic zodiac tour, or a coastal hike, with Captain Dildo Expedition Tours.

North of Dildo, explore the picturesque coastal Baccalieu Trail, not least HEART'S CONTENT, featuring the Heart's Content Cable Station, to learn how the transatlantic telegraph cable advanced modern communications, from the mid-19th to the mid-20th Century.

Don't miss the historic community of CUPIDS (originally 'Cupers Cove') - the first 'planned settlement' in this New Founde Land, following John Guy's arrival here in 1610 - which has recently celebrated its 400th anniversary. Visit the excellent Cupids Legacy Centre, plus the nearby archaeological dig – surely worthy of 'national', not just 'provincial', heritage status! Enjoy lunch at the lofty

Cupids Haven B&B & Tea Room (www.cupidshaven.ca).

Drive a few minutes down the road to cutside BRIGUS, whose history dates back to around 1612, when said John Guy sold half the harbour to the Spracklin family. Visit Hawthorn Cottage (National Historic Site) - birthplace of arctic explorer, Bob Bartlett; plus the nearby reconstructed Stone Barn Museum.

Also explore the coastal Irish Loop in the southern part of the Avalon Peninsula, taking in BAY BULLS - home to O'Brien's Whale & Bird Tours (www.obriensboattours.com), offering a 2-hour sea adventure around the Witless Bay Ecological Reserve, boasting puffins, whales and icebergs in season.

A further ½-hour drive south, don't miss FERRYLAND and the grassy hills of the 1621-founded Colony of Avalon (www.colonyofavalon.ca) archaeological dig, followed by a leisurely hike along the footpaths to the Ferryland Lighthouse, with its well-nigh institutional picnics - (www.lighthousepicnics.ca) for a deliciously local 'hamper' lunch, amidst stunning scenery, including the 1870 lighthouse itself.

Clubbing

Cyprus, rather lyrically shaped like a lute, is the birthplace of Aphrodite, goddess of beauty and love. It is the third largest island in the Mediterranean Sea, and at only four hours flight from Manchester Airport via Monarch, this is an accessible alternative to holidaying in Gran Canaria or Sitges.

Different Bar in Paphos is a trendy bar at 6-7 Ayia Napa Street. Things start getting into their stride about 11pm here. Expect the latest club hits and a cool vibe.

Secrets Freedom Club is the busiest and biggest gay venue on the island, which welcomes straight clubbers as well, if you're travelling with hetero friends. There are regular theme nights and special events, so it's usually best to check out secretsfreedomclub.com before you head out. There's a chillout lounge and internet access, and the entry fee includes a free drink. The club is located on Airport Road, 67 Artemidas Avenue in Larnaca.

Alaloum is the oldest gay bar in Cyprus, located at 1 Loutron Street in Old Town. The bar is hidden away, so you'll have to travel towards the old port road, turn left just before the roundabout and then walk down the little alley to get there. Expect a traditional gay experience, with a varied crowd and the island's local drag queens.

Escape Club, in the heart of Limassol, is at Makarios Avenue 81, opposite Bodyline, and is one of the trendiest hotspots on the island, with a late licence to keep disco dollies happy.

the rocks you'll find a stretch of beach that's almost entirely composed of sunbathing men (if you're lucky).

Dassoudi Beach in Limassol is a family-friendly beach, but at night the area behind Pizza Hut becomes very cruisy indeed. However discretion is advised, because you're as likely to come across straight people taking a late-night walk as you are gay men looking to do their thing.

Governor's Beach has beautiful white chalk bays, which are almost enough to distract from the men in trunks on the sand. Finally there's Nissi Beach in Ayia Napa, which includes family areas, nudist areas and a gay cruising spot.



Whether you want to hit the nightclubs of Ayia Napa or bask in the peaceful sun of Paphos, whether you fancy water skiing in the blue waters of Limassol or snow skiing in the Troodos mountains—Cyprus has something for everyone. What's more, the people all speak English and everyone drives on the left side of the road. For the discerning gay traveller in need of a tan, the decision is a simple one.

Beaches

Cyprus has plentiful beaches, from soft white sand beaches to pebble beaches, from nudist beaches to family beaches. There's always something to entertain the gay traveller.

In Coral Bay is Sea Caves Beach, which is just outside Paphos. The beach is popular both with nudists looking to get a tan and cruisers looking to get a man. Most of the beach is covered with pebbles, so flip-flops are advised, but there are some patches of sand.

Pissouri Beach, which is halfway between Limassol and Paphos, has its own nudist area too. Behind

For sporty types there are cycling routes as well. Events this year include the FxPro Cyprus Rally, the Lemesos Wine Festival, and 'Kataklysmos' Flood Festivals in Larnaca and Ayia Napa.

Consider also visits to the Archbishop's Palace, the Maa Palaeokastro Settlement from the Late Bronze Age and the wonders of the Tombs of the Kings.

To be eligible for Preferred Pride, hotels must be either TAG Approved® (Community Marketing's Travel Alternative Group) or belong to IGLTA® (International Gay & Lesbian Travel Association). Both organizations are universally recognized to set the standards for LGBT travel.

As part of the Preferred Pride program, diversity training is offered to hotels to provide insight in best practices in serving the LGBT community from check-in to check-out. Participating hotels may choose to assign an internal ambassador who has completed the training and will champion the activity within the hotel. Training suggestion examples include providing bathrobes, slippers, and toiletries befitting same sex couples; having a knowledgeable concierge who can provide a list of the area's best attractions, dining and nightlife; or simply including publications within the hotel that acknowledge the specific guest's interests. In addition, training will provide the hotels with ideas on how they can take a more active role in their local LGBT community through activities, sponsorship and support.

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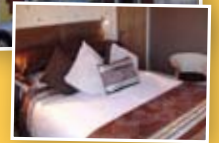
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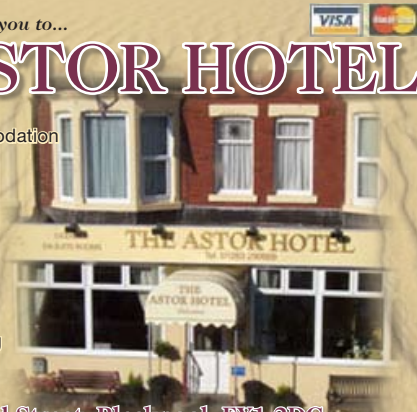

The advert is part of a launch campaign called 'AKT Now' created by TBWA/London for the Albert Kennedy Trust, a charity set up specifically to help and support disadvantaged lesbian, gay, bisexual and Transgender individuals, up to the age of 25, who have faced homophobic bullying, abuse and homelessness. 'AKT NOW' encourages you to donate £15, give 15 hours of your time or even better donate £15 on a monthly basis, all of which is driven through the website: www.akt.org.uk

A little bit about AKT:

The charity was founded following the death of Albert Kennedy, a 17 year old who was the victim of a homophobic attack, ending in his tragic death falling from a multi-storey car park. Cath Hall, a heterosexual foster carer and

founder of AKT, noticed that a lot of young LGBT people were being thrown out of home by their families and set up the charity to help to help to deal with the increasing issues.

Since it began in 1989, the Albert Kennedy Trust has provided help and support to disadvantaged Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender individuals up to the age of 25, who have faced homophobic bullying, abuse and homelessness. The services offered, including mentoring, advice help lines, education and long term re-housing, ensuring that these individuals get back on track and fulfil their potential. Some real stories:

"My brother told me he knew I was gay and would tell my parents. I thought they would try to kill me when they found out. I stood on the Tube platform and heard the train coming - I just wanted everything to be over. Then I thought to myself 'why do I need to do this?' I took a few steps back and then got on the train to go home. I knew I had to do something"

"The day after a teacher 'outed' me in the classroom the bullying got worse. On the way home on the bus some older guys from school started to shout abuse at me then one of them knifed me. As I ran from the bus I was petrified of how my mum would react when she found out I was attacked for being gay"

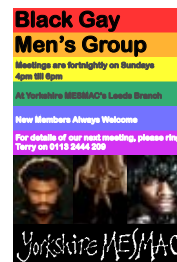
Each podcast covers essential information for Africans on HIV in five segments:-

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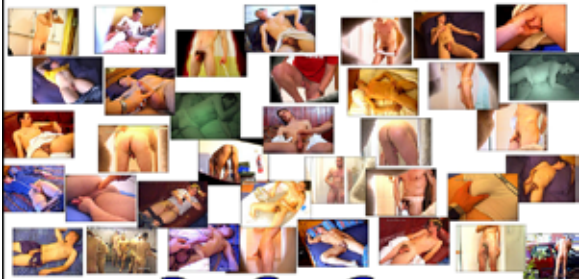
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
